

UBER-QUILT-FEST ~ BLOCK FOUR

"CABIN IN THE WOODS"

12½" BLOCK (12" FINISHED)

I named my block Cabin in the Woods because it implies that the cabin is hidden. This block uses log cabin techniques, but it doesn't really look like a log cabin block, so I thought the name was appropriate.

Cutting Instructions:

- 1) From each of the two fabrics for the center four patch, cut 2 -- 2½" squares (4 total).
- 2) From the fabric for the first two "logs" (larger rectangles), cut 1 -- 2½" x 5" and 1 -- 2½" x 7"
- 3) From the fabric for the second two "logs," cut 1 -- 2" x 7½," and 1 -- 2" x 9"
- 4) From the fabric for the third set of "logs," cut 1 -- 3½" x 9½" and 1 -- 3½" x 12½"
- 5) From the fabric for the "mortar" (dark, narrow strips), cut 1 -- 1" x 4½," 1 -- 1" x 5," 1 -- 1" x 7," 1 -- 1" x 7½," 1 -- 1" x 9," and 1 -- 1" x 9½"



Sewing Instructions:

- 1) First take the 4 -- 2½" squares for the center four patch and sew them together as shown in **Figure A**.
- 2) Sew the mortar and logs on in the following order as shown in **Figure B**. Press all seams toward the outside of the block.
 1. Mortar 1" x 4½"
 2. Mortar 1" x 5"
 3. First Logs 2½" x 5"
 4. First Logs 2½" x 7"
 5. Mortar 1" x 7"
 6. Mortar 1" x 7½"
 7. Second Logs 2" x 7½"
 8. Second Logs 2" x 9"
 9. Mortar 1" x 9"
 10. Mortar 1" x 9½"
 11. Third Logs 3½" x 9½"
 12. Third Logs 3½" x 12½"

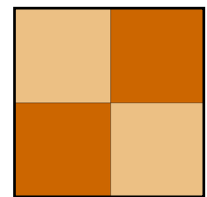

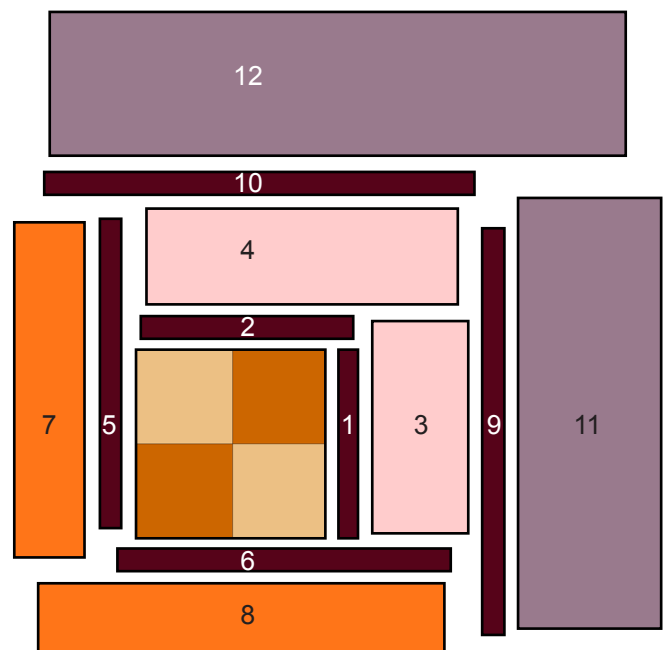
